


Dear Eighth Grade Class of 2023,

Your summer Reading assignment is to read two books. One book I have chosen for you, but the second one you may choose from the list included. This will be your first 8th grade assignment. It is due in school on the first full day of school.

Please read the following book and complete the work.



The Outsiders by S.E. Hinton

This story was written by a teenager about teenagers. It is told in a first-person narration style, with the narrator being a 14-year-old boy.

Writing Assignment: There are many ways to report on a book once you have read it. After you have read *The Outsiders*, choose three methods of reporting on the book that interest you. There are two papers attached. One has nine options, and one has a diagram with numbers 1-9 and the methods. You are going to "play" a form of "Tic Tac Toe" when you make your three choices. Choose three in a row horizontally, vertically or diagonally.

Hopefully, you will be reading all summer. Read at least one other book from the list on the back of this paper. Be prepared to **write** a short summary of this book during the first week of school **in school**.

We will be reading ***Where the Red Fern Grows*** by Wilson Rawls and ***The Outsiders*** by S.E. Hinton. You will need **WTRFG** in September. Please don't read this book or watch the movie during the summer. We will watch it when we finish reading the book.

***Where the Red Fern Grows* by Wilson Rawls

You need *Where the Red Fern Grows* for the first full week of September.

Activities for THE OUTSIDERS

1. **Guess Who or What!**
This report takes the form of the game "Twenty Questions." The reporter writes a series of clues about a character from the story in a vague to precise, general to specific order. It is necessary to have an answer sheet for the questions.
2. **Coming Attraction!**
The Outsiders is about to be made into a movie and you have been chosen to design the promotional poster. Include the title and author of the book, a listing of the main characters and the contemporary actors who will play them, a drawing of a scene from the book, and a paragraph synopsis of the story. Use poster board.
3. **Literary Interview**
Conduct the interview with a family member (they would ask you the questions). Record the interview. Bring the recording into school, and we will listen to your interview.

Your family member will play the role of a television or radio interviewer, trying to provide the audience with insights into the character's personality and life. It is your responsibility to create meaningful questions and appropriate responses.
4. **Sales Talk**
This report serves as an advertisement to "sell" *The Outsiders* to one or more specific groups. You decide on the group to target and the sales pitch you will use. Include some kind of graphics in your presentation.
5. **A Character Comes to Life**
Suppose one of the characters in *The Outsiders* came to life and walked into our home or classroom? Write what this character see, hears, and feels as he or she experiences the world in which you live.
6. **Into the Future.**
Billy Colman has made his journey back to the Ozarks and has visited the graves of his dogs. Red ferns and wildflowers now completely cover the hilltop where his dogs were buried. However, time has worn at the sandstone marker where he had carved their names so many years ago. Billy decides to make a new grave marker, one that will tell the story of his dogs as well as their names. Draw the grave marker and write the words that will tell all who read them how special Old Dan and Little Ann were to Billy.
7. **Make a Crossword Puzzle** for *The Outsiders*. You must have a minimum of 15 DOWN clues, and a minimum of 15 ACROSS clues. Since there are twenty chapters, have at least one clue from each chapter. This may be done on the computer or on graph paper. An answer key must be provided.
8. **"A Letter to the Author"**
In this report, you can write a letter to S.E. Hinton. Tell her what you liked about *The Outsiders*, and ask her any questions you may have about the writing of the book. You might want to give her new suggestions for a sequel!
9. **Make a Word Search Puzzle** with vocabulary words from *The Outsiders*. You will need to use at least 30 words for your puzzle. This may be done on the computer or graph paper. An answer key must be provided as well as a list of the 30 words.
